

2019 SPINE Summer School

Grant Writing and Data Management Plan

August 19-21, 2019 in Lausanne

Identifying an appropriate potential grant maker can be one of the most challenging parts of the grant writing process. Funders are increasingly requiring grant applicants to submit data management plans (DMPs) with their grant proposals, in an effort to promote data sharing and responsible stewardship of data by researchers. To help you face these challenges, the 5th SPINE Summer School provides information and tools on grant writing, including budgeting, and construction of a Data Management Plan.

The 2019 Spine Summer School will be conducted interactively and provide participants with the opportunity to attain an advanced level of knowledge on the writing of grants and DMPs. The program includes the presentation and discussion of different types of grants, with real projects granted in Switzerland as well as hands-on exercises on DMPs. The summer school is open to PhD students in nursing science as well as other stakeholders of research in the medical field.

*The course fee includes course materials and refreshments during coffee breaks. Participation fees do not include meals, accommodation or travel expenses. Students are expected to make their own accommodation arrangements as necessary. Registration is conditional upon full payment of fees.

**To qualify for the PhD fee, applicants are required to submit a letter from their supervisor stating their actual position as a doctoral student

- Seating is limited to 40 participants. All participants must commit to attending the full 3 days course. Applicants are selected on a first come first serve basis. Only complete applications are considered. Notification of acceptance will be emailed within 3 weeks of the closing date.
